

The Geographical Boundaries of Christ the King

Beginning on the Mississippi River and the East Baton Rouge-West Baton Rouge civil parish line at a point across from the western terminus of West Chimes Street, to the least along a line south of and parallel to West Chimes Street (excluding both sides of the street) to a point just east of Alaska Street; thence to the north along a line just east of and parallel to Alaska Street (excluding both sides) to West Roosevelt Street; thence to the east along the center line of West Roosevelt Street to a point just west of and excluding Highland Road; thence to the south along a line just west of and parallel to Highland Road to West Chimes Street; thence to the east along the center line of West Chimes Street across Highland Road and east along the center line of East Chimes Street to a point just east of (and excluding) Carlotta Street; thence to the north along a line east of and parallel to Carlotta Street to a point just south of and excluding East State Street; thence to the east along a line just south of and parallel to East State Street to the shore of University Lake; thence to the south along the shore of University Lake until it reaches East Parker Boulevard; thence to the southwest along the center line of East Parker Boulevard across Highland Road to West Parker Boulevard and continuing southwest along the center line of West Parker Boulevard until Burbank Drive; thence to the northwest along the center line of Burbank Drive to Gourrier Avenue; thence west along the center line of Gourrier Avenue to Nicholson Drive; thence south along the center line of Nicholson Drive to its intersection with Brightside Drive; thence to the west along the center line of Brightside Drive to the River Road and extending from this terminus into the Mississippi River to the East Baton Rouge-West Baton Rouge civil parish line; thence to the north along this civil parish line and the Mississippi River to a point across from the western terminus of West Chimes Street, the point of origin.

N.B. Christ the King Parish is also a personal parish, and so includes the students, faculty, and support staff of Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge, and their households, even if these reside outside of its territorial boundaries.
